


New Zealand's Relationship with China



Figure 27: Regulatory obstacles when doing business in China, 2013-2014






China's Retail Growth





Exports to China in 2013







Fastest growing export commodities, top 3 markets (2008-2013, \$b)





NZ's share of Chinese Imports, 2013










China's share of NZ Imports

China's share of NZ Imports, 2013









Visitors to New Zealand



Visitor expenditure in NZ


